

WEAKLEY COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY
REGULAR MEETING JULY 18, 1994

Call to order was given by Co. Exec. Kerry Killebrew and invocation was given by Comm. Mac Buckley. The pledge of allegiance was given by all and Sheriff Mike Wilson opened court. County Clerk Faye Butts called roll with all Commissioners present. Approval of the minutes of regular and special called meeting. Motion was made by Comm. Mac Buckley and seconded by Comm. Vernon Dunn. After a voice vote, motion carried.

TRUSTEE, GENERAL FUND, HIGHWAY AND SCHOOL DEPT. REPORT: Motion to accept all of these reports were made by Comm. J. T. Walker and seconded by Comm. John R. Oliver. After a voice vote, motion carried.

AMBULANCE COMMITTEE REPORT: Comm. Earl Wright, chairman, reported that all was going well with the ambulance service. Motion to accept this report was made by Comm. Jimmy Brasfield and seconded by Comm. Dick Phebus. After a voice vote, motion carried.

HEW COMMITTEE REPORT: Comm. Vincent, chairman, passed out Solid Waste Mgt. Plans to the commission. The committee will look over this before they approve it. The county commission will have to approve it and will have to have one (1) public reading before it goes into effect. The rural pick-up rates will start going down October 1, 1994. The more people the lesser the charge. If the 911 is passed on the ballot August 4, a board will be appointed. Chairman Vincent noted that the HEW committee unanimously approves E911. Motion to accept this report was made by Comm. John Bucy and seconded by Comm. Dick Phebus. After a voice vote, motion carried.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT: Comm. Vernon Dunn, chairman, reported that everything was going well. Motion to accept this report was made by Comm. Mac Buckley and seconded by Comm. Jerry Carpenter. After a voice vote, motion carried.

LAW ENFORCEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT: Comm. VanCleave, chairman, reported they had met and passed their budget and also, reported that Troy Jones, Juvenile officer, found where they had said that as of September 1, 1994 the Juvenile Judge would get a raise. It was under resolution 1990-12. Comm. VanCleave reported that the state is saying they are possibly going to increase the state load of prisoner for the county, but are not going to pay the extra money, and there is the possibility of a deficit next year and may have to come back to court and ask for more money. According to the state figures there maybe a \$49,000.00 shortfall. This may not happen, but to let you know in advance. Motion to accept this report was made by Comm. J. T. Walker and seconded by Comm. Joe Brasher. After a voice vote, motion carried.

NURSING HOME REPORT: No comment from Adm. David McBride. Report was turned in. Motion to accept this report was made by Comm. Wayne McCreight and seconded by Comm. Earl Wright. After a voice vote, motion carried. Report on page 499

After a voice vote, motion failed.

Comm. Johnny Vincent makes a motion that a nominating committee be appointed to search for a new county attorney and report back on August 8th meeting. Comm. Jerry Carpenter seconded the motion. After a voice vote, motion carried. He ask that the committee consist of Comm. Joe Brasher, Comm. John R. Oliver, and Comm. Dick Phebus.

Motion to recess was made by Comm. Dick Phebus and seconded by Comm. John R. Oliver. Court will recess to August 8, 1994. After a voice vote, motion carried.
